

U. S. On Covers

- 126 Justice 2c, 6c, on one cover, 12c on another cover; very fine, rare.
 127 State 1c, 2c together on 1 cover, the 1c slightly damaged.
 128 — 2c green cancellation heavy, but very rare on cover.
 129 — 3c, 7c used together on 1 cover; 15c on another cover.
 130 — 24c green, lightly cancelled, very fine, very rare.
 131 Navy 3c, Treasury 2c, 7c; State 3c, Interior 3c, all on covers.

CARRIERS

- 132 1851 1c blue on rose, Franklin (801), on entire cover, with light red cancellation. From the contents of the envelope this was used Oct. 28, 1852. The stamp itself is in fine condition in spite of a slight stain. Very rare in any shape and particularly so on cover.
 133 — 1c blue on deep rose, a perfect copy with the red five pointed star cancellation. Used in Philadelphia March 9, 1852.
 134 — 1c blue on rose, clear early impression, cancelled with red star; used in Philadelphia Dec. 3, 1851; the stamp trifle close at right, but rare and desirable.
 135 — 1c blue Eagle (802), 4 covers each with 1 stamp in connection with the 3c of 1851.
 136 — 1c blue horizontal pair used on cover, cancelled with pencil. This pair probably represents the dropped letter rate plus carrier.
 137 — 1c light blue, horizontal strip of 4 on cover, cancelled Philadelphia and addressed to New York. Three of these stamps did duty as a rate from Philadelphia to New York, the fourth stamp only being used as a carrier. The stamps have the usual red five pointed star cancellation. Two of the stamps are creased and one is close at bottom. The cover is very rare as showing the use of these stamps in place of the regular postage.
 138 — 1c dark blue, vertical strip of 3 and single used on piece of cover. As in Lot 137, only one of the stamps is really a carrier, the other three representing postage from Philadelphia,

- to where we cannot tell as the address is missing. The strip of 3 is in good condition, the single damaged at upper left.
 225- 139 Baltimore 1c black ((803), on envelope 1853, 3c red (1314), the carrier lightly pen-cancelled.
 475- 140 — 1c black variety "Sent" (803a), with 1857 3c lightly cancelled in blue, the carrier having the additional cancellation in pencil; very fine, rare.
 525- 141 — 1c red (804), with 1857 3c, the carrier pen-cancelled; very fine.
 1030- 142 — 1852 1c red on bluish (805), enormous margins, lightly cancelled in pencil.
 525- 143 — 1c dark blue (807), pen-cancelled, very large margins.
 50- 144 — 1c green (808), lightly cancelled with lead pencil; a very fine copy of this great rarity.
 4,10- 145 — 1856 1c blue (810), close at bottom.
 5- 146 — 1c red (811), with the 1857 3c (43), both stamps cancelled in blue "Baltimore, April 14, 1859." Carriers with anything but pen cancellation are very rare.
 625- 147 Boston 1849 1c blue (813), light red cancellation, the stamp creased by a fold in the letter.
 525- 148 — 1c blue on bluish (815), used with 1851 3c, the stamp very fine though close at lower right.
 625- 149 Charleston 1851 2c black (824), pen cancelled, very fine.
 5- 150 — 2c on bluish paper (825), pen cancelled, very fine.
 825- 151 — 2c black on grayish paper (827), pen cancelled, very fine.
 16- 152 New York 1842 3c on blue wove (846), the letter dated Sept. 24, 1842; the stamp lightly cancelled in red "U. S." in frame. Very fine.
 8-5- 153 — 3c on blue glazed (848), a magnificent copy, light red cancellation "New York, Dec. 24, 2c." This cancellation entirely different from the regular Dispatch; very rare.
 675- 154 — 3c blue glazed (848), with the usual U. S. in frame in red; very fine.
 610- 155 — 3c on green glazed (849), cancelled "U. S." in red; very fine though creased at lower left.
 51- 156 — 3c on green glazed (849), 4 copies on a cover cancelled New York, Aug. 22 (1843), and addressed to Philadelphia. The stamps have the usual U. S. in frame cancellation, but the cover

is marked "Paid single" and stamped in red "Paid" with the figures "12" in blue ink. The 4 stamps therefore paid postage from New York to Philadelphia, and this cover is probably the earliest known case of a letter carried in the United States from one city to another with the postage paid by stamps, and should take rank among the rarest of the Post Masters Provisionals which it really is.

- 525- 157 - 1846 1c rose (852), pen cancellation.
 425- 158 - 1c yellow (853), cancelled with lead pencil, but the regular New York cancellation in red falls partly on the stamp.
 510 159 - 1c buff (854), lightly pen cancelled.
 2010 160 Philadelphia 1849 1c rose (855), light blue cancellation just touches lower right corner. The stamp has been creased by a fold in the letter.
 16- 161 - 1c rose with letter "S" (856), on cover with 1847 5c, the cover is cancelled Philadelphia, Jan. 17, 1851. The carrier stamp is not cancelled.
 29- 162 - 1c rose with letter "H" (857), on piece of cover, but not cancelled.
 52- 163 - 1c blue glazed (860) on a letter cancelled May 12, 1850. The carrier which is uncanceled is slightly damaged at upper left corner, but a great rarity in any condition.
 1650 164 - 1851 1c gold on black (863), with light blue cancellation which is scarcely visible; very rare.
 2850 165 - 1c blue (864), very fine copy with the red five pointed star cancellation.

LOCALS

- 21- 166 Barnards Cariboo Express 1858 green (2222), on cover with a pair of Canada 1859 12½c green (19); the letter is addressed Care of Barnards Express, Yale, British Columbia, and bears date June 25, 1864. It has written on it 75 cents, which was probably the amount collected for the delivery. Very rare especially on a cover and in this condition.
 1450 167 Griffin 1c black (2490), used with the 1857 3c type I. The two stamps are cancelled together Baltimore in blue. Very fine, rare.

- 1360168 Pomeroy 1843 5c black (2673), horizontal strip of 4 lightly cancelled in red; the letter bearing date July 31, 1844.
 525- 169 Swarts 1846 blue (2730), lightly cancelled in red New York Feb. 4, 1850.
 310 170 - red (2733), cancelled in black on a letter cancelled New York, Oct. 31, and addressed to Altdorf, Bavaria; rare in this shape.
 9- 171 Wells Fargo 1860 \$1 red, \$2 green (2757), 2758), used on cover with the 10c of 1857.
