



Four Known Valentines One with 3 Stamps February 15, 1854

Three stamps in **shape of a heart**, underpaid by two stamps, likely reason for Blood's **late** delivery **February 15th**.







Type 17 Handstamp was Blood's first 20 mm diameter; known from September 4, 1851 until January 11, 1855. Blood's first with time of delivery.

**Imitation** is the sincerest form of flattery. Competitor Teese & Comimicked Blood's Penny Post blue & pink stamps. Teese prepaid stamp was dropped into Blood's collection box ans serviced by Blood's confirmed by dated handstamp. One known outbound at top; one known local delivery at bottom.




