Daniel Otis Blood died age 34 on September 21, 1853. For 4 years Charles Kochersperger had been proprietor and active manager. An entirely new stamp with likeness of Henry Clay was created. It's black oval band proclaimed both **Blood's Penny Post** and **Kochersperger & Co.** Only essays spelled out the full name of Philadelphia, top left. All stamps sold by prior companies were valid and serviced.

Of all Blood's issues, essays and proofs are only known of the final stamp.







Kochersperger introduced **oval handstamp** markings with numeral 1 or diagonal lines, to cancel stamps, in tandem with circular datestamps. **Type F** "scarab" known from January 20, 1859 until December 7, 1861.


