CHESUNCOOK LAKE

These "moose stamps" were in use by a hotel in Chesuncook Lake, Maine, between 1885 and 1893.

Leonard Hilton, owner of the Chesuncook House hotel established the post for his guests. Guides would deliver the mail between the hunting and fishing camps in the area and the nearest post office at North East Carry.

The stamps were available in a 1¢ green, a 3¢ brown, and a 5¢ blue.
