Little is known about this Philadelphia local post. It only existed for a few months in 1860, delivering within the old city of Philadelphia.

The stamps, printed from plates of 100, were printed on papers of varying thickness. The design appears to be, at least partially, based on the Kochersperger & Co. Blood's Penny Post stamps. It has a similar dark oval border with white text. The central design of the City Dispatch stamps feature a woman holding scales and a sword, representing Justice.

Below is a stampless cover, mailed by a City Dispatch handstamp. The City Dispatch of Philadelphia used three handstamps: a circular "PAID" stamp (type 1); a circular "Prompt Delivery" time and datestamp (type 11); and a circular stamp with crosshatching in the center (type 111), which was primarily used as a killer for stamps. The type 11 handstamp, featured below, is listed in the *American Stampless Cover Catalog*, Vol. 11, on page 68.

"Collect  $2^{cts}$ " is written in pencil on the front. This indicates that along with 1¢ prepaid delivery, the City Dispatch provided a collect-on-delivery service for an additional cent.

This cover features an embossed corner advertisement for the Continental Hotel. This hotel, located on the Southeast corner of 9th and Chestunut streets in Philadelphia, completed its construction in February of 1860.

Featured here is a cover prepaid with both a 1¢ City Dispatch and a 3¢ US postage stamp. The City Dispatch stamp paid delivery to the post, while the 3¢ stamp paid for the letter's delivery through the US postal system to Sarah Campbell in New York.

S. A. Taylor's design has a very crude drawn lady, and the separation lines have been replaced by periods. The stamps also lack the border found on the genuine examples. Unusual for Taylor's work, this forgery comes in only a few colors.

It is unknown who made the following forgery of this post's stamp. It exists in a wide variety of colors, and often with fake cancels. One of these cancels is a Parisian handstamp, suggesting that the forger could have been French. The design is very close to the that of the genuine stamps, but one way to tell it apart is by the much more noticeable periods between the zigzags of the inner oval border.
