The information and identification within these selections is the individual work of the Farrell Collection. It is always recommended to consult multiple sources for additional information or opinions. Local post company descriptions are based on information available at the time of writing.

Descriptions in the Farrell Collection were written based on personal research and sources including, but not limited to: Articles in the Carriers and Locals Society's The Penny Post; Amos Media's Scott Catalogue; Patton's The Private Local Post of the United States; Springer's Handbook of North American Cinderella Stamps; Lyons' Identifier for Carriers, Locals, Fakes Forgeries and Bogus Posts of the United States; articles in the USPCS's The Chronicle; Mosher's Catalog of Private Express Labels and Stamps; The Eastern Independent Mail Companies and Express Mail Companies 1840-1845; Elliot Perry's Pat Paragraphs; James N. Drummond's Catalog of Philatelic Miscellany; and the notes of George Sloane and Gordon Stimmell.

Colors listed for stamps and forgeries are the opinions of the Farrell Collection based on viewing physical copies of the pieces under consistent lighting. Colors in the .pdfs may be slightly inaccurate due to manipulations from the scanning process, computer monitor settings, or (in event that the files are printed for offline viewing) the printing process.

Unless otherwise noted, stamps are identified by their Scott Catalogue numbers and forgeries are identified by their Lyons Identifier type. Scott numbers in parenthesis under listed forgeries represent approximately what stamp the forgery is attempting to imitate.

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This New York local post, operated by C. C. Clark, ran for only two months in the winter of 1856 - 1857. Clark & Co. issued one stamp design - a simple letterbox in red on yellow paper. Genuine examples of this 1¢ stamp are scarce.

The short-lived post was not very successful. Clark sold the business to Abner S. Brady in 1857. Brady then continued as Brady & Co. until 1858.

When Brady took over, he continued to use the same stamp design with only the name changed.

J. W. Scott made two different forgeries of the "Clark & Co." stamp. The first one is based on one of the illustrations published in his catalogues. This forgery completely lacks the letters "NP" in the box's shading lines, and is also missing the comma after "CLARK". The other design is closer to the genuine stamp, but the "NP" in the shading lines has been replaced with a symbol that looks like a "greater-than" sign ( > ) with a dot inside it and a dot to the right of it. There's also a constant break in the circular line above the "A" of "CLARK".

This second forgery had at least two different printings. One printing is on a white paper, and is known in a horizontal strip which have two other forgeries made by Scott. These forgeries are one of his "Barr's Penny Dispatch" designs and his "A. M. Hinkley's Express Co." design. The other printing is on a thin cream paper, with larger margins and known in vertical pairs.

S. Allan Taylor's forgery comes in a wide variety of colors. Most likely he based his design on the illustration in J.-B. Moens' 1864 catalogue, as it is very similar to it and even has the extra border. An easy way to tell Taylor's design apart though is thanks to the appearance of a dot above the "O" of "ONE".

Of the next three designs, the first one has an apostrophe after "CLARK" in stead of a comma, while the second one is missing the period after "CENT". Both designs were made by unknown forgers. The last of these three designs was lithographed by Pierre Schmitz for J.-B. Moens' 1864 catalogue. The "NP" has been replaced by a clear area with two small vertical lines to the left, a " $\nu$ " at the top, and two small diagonal lines and a " > " to the bottom-left.
