THE EMPORIUM & GOLDEN RULE BAZAAR COMPANY HISTORY

The Emporium and Golden Rule Bazaar was a department store in San Francisco, California. The store offered a mail order delivery service, both for local deliveries and shipment out of state. The store was established in 1897, but destroyed in the 1906 earthquake. It reopened in 1908 and continued business. It is believed the delivery service was supplanted by UPS in 1925.
